

**Adopt A School: East Elementary**

East Elementary School is a Littleton Public School with over 80% of its student population eligible for free lunch and ESL services. St. Andrew members are involved in their afterschool homework club, book drives and scholarships for their 5<sup>th</sup> grade Outdoor Lab program.

**Bridgeway**

Bridgeway is a loving home for homeless, pregnant teens between the ages of 16-21 years old, and provides the young mothers and their babies with shelter, food, clothing, support, and education. Residents attest that their sojourn at Bridgeway was the turning point to a better life for themselves and their children.

**Colorado Aids Project**

Colorado Aids Project improves the lives of those affected by HIV and AIDS, and supports efforts to prevent HIV infection. The Agency adopted an innovative approach to chronic disease management that focuses on creating healthy, self-sufficient lifestyles through an integrated evidence-based program of individualized services and a continuum of care. Today, CAP's programs include case management, mental health and substance abuse counseling, an award winning food bank, transportation services, housing services, legal referrals, and an employment center. Additionally, CAP provides a wide array of prevention counseling, testing and education programs.

**Denver Inner City Parish**

Denver Inner City Parish is a non-denominational, non-profit agency to serve the secular and spiritual needs of West Denver's low-income community.

**Denver Rescue Mission**

The Denver Rescue Mission is changing lives in the name of Christ by meeting people at their physical and spiritual points of need with the goal of returning them to society as productive, self-sufficient citizens. The Denver Rescue Mission is the oldest, full-scale Christian charity in the Rocky Mountain region. St. Andrew assists with Thanksgiving meals.

**Denver Urban Ministries (Denum)**

DenUm provides many services to inner city individuals and families in crisis including a food pantry, infant supplies, legal counseling, securing government identification cards, health screenings and more. DenUm also offers job readiness training, use of equipment such as computers, internet, telephones, etc., and support services such as bus tokens, uniforms, work clothing, and hygiene items.

**El Centro Humanitario**

El Centro promotes the rights and well-being of day laborers in Denver through education, job skills and leadership development, united action and advocacy. The agency sponsors worker owned Green Cleaning for Life, LLC, a cooperative business to expand quality job opportunities to low income members of the community. They also campaign to end wage

theft through legal action to reducing wage exploitation of temporary laborers.

### **Family Homestead**

Children comprise 63% of Family Homestead's total client population served. Families are provided with individual living units for emergency housing and relies on the local community rather than Federal government funds. The Transitional Housing Program moves families into permanent housing in established neighborhoods within six months.

### **Food Banks**

The four food banks supported by Outreach Ministries (Colorado AIDS Project, DenUM, IFCS and Denver Inner City Parish) supply non-perishable food and personal care items to those in need.

### **Habitat For Humanity**

St. Andrew supports this self-sufficiency homebuilding program and also provides volunteers who share their expertise and labor to build affordable, decent homes for those in need. We are members of the Habitat Interfaith Alliance with twelve Protestant, Catholic, Jewish and Unitarian congregations.

### **Interfaith Community Services**

Inter-Faith Community Services provides a long list of basic human services and enrichment programs to low-income people using community resources. Inter-Faith fosters self-sufficiency and respects the dignity of each client. Inter-Faith serves the people of Centennial, Englewood, Glendale, Highlands Ranch, Littleton, Lone Tree, Sheridan and unincorporated Arapahoe County.

### **Interfaith Hospitality Network**

Interfaith Hospitality Network is a comprehensive program designed to temporarily help families while they "get back on their feet". Rotating with other churches in our community, we partner to provide room and board for prescreened families who are experiencing homelessness.

### **St. Paul UMC**

We sponsor The Sunday Meal Program through St. Paul UMC that feeds men, women, teens and families with small children on the one day of the week that other programs do not operate. A hot, sit-down, nourishing meal is provided and is often the only meal these folks will have on Sunday. St. Andrew volunteers staff this program the second Sunday of each month.

### **Streetreach**

Streetreach offers lunch on Mondays to the homeless. Located at St. Paul's Lutheran, St. Andrew provides desserts.

**TLC Meals on Wheels**

TLC Meals on Wheels enhances the quality of life for the fast-growing senior population as well as for persons with disabilities in the Littleton area. Many of those receiving the service have very limited resources. Without the meals TLC provides, clients would be unable to live independently and would be in nursing homes with public assistance. The volunteers develop lasting friendships with the people who receive meals.

**Urban Peak**

Urban Peak helps homeless youth, and youth at risk of becoming homeless, overcome real life challenges by providing essential services and a supportive community, empowering them to become self-sufficient adults.

**Warren Village**

Warren Village is a unique family community helping motivated low-income, previously homeless single parent families move from public assistance to personal and economic self-sufficiency through subsidized housing, on-site nationally accredited child care, intensive case management, educational guidance and career development.
